Daily Thought

Sometimes things can seem in a way which is not so. Lack of obedience does not always mean lack of faith, fear does not always mean doubt, and certain things in life are just life. Abraham was not always honest – “She is my sister”. He didn’t always wait on God – remember Ishmael. But Abraham did always think of God even in his sleep – “In his sleep he saw God as a fire pot.” We are not perfect, we are human and God knows this. God loves us not just for our doings but because we look to him.

Word of Growth

We’ve previously covered the covenant (promise) of Genesis 15. In this chapter, God gave Abram a great reward. God took an oath by Himself ‘without man’. This promise was to eternity, continual blessings as well as the land of Canaan, ‘the land flowing with milk and honey’ (heaven). God promised Abram descendants as numerous as the stars (us) and we are numerous. God promised blessings and Abram was blessed: Isaac, land, possessions and even being known as the friend of God. James 2:23, “And the scripture was fulfilled which says, ‘Abraham believed God, and it was accounted to him for righteousness.’ And he was called the friend of God.”

Why did God do all this? Abraham believed God, he was concerned with doing the righteousness of God. Was Abraham always perfect? No, Abraham, too, sinned before God. He, too, tried human means to obtain his desires, “Hagar”, “Ishmael”, “Egypt”. One thing Abraham had was his faithfulness towards God. In Chapter 15, Abraham fell into a great sleep, a sleep with a great darkness. Fear? While dreaming, Abraham saw God as a firepot and a torch fulfilling the covenant. I first read this as God making a covenant alone while Abraham slept and that is what happened. But notice, Abraham even thought of God in his sleep. While sleeping he saw God – now that’s faithful! This is the faith I wish to obtain. I may not be perfect and may never be, but if we do, we do it toward God, then perfection would be near.

Daily Thought

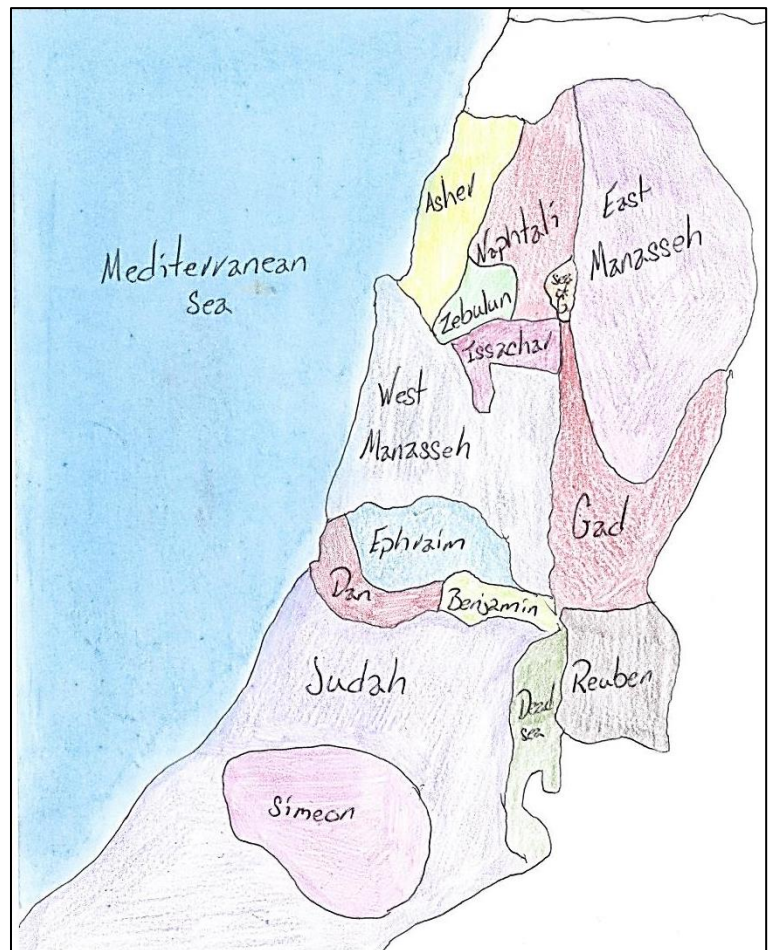

Word of Growth

“Yahweh Yireh” – “The Lord will provide”

I enjoy reading from Genesis (the beginning). This book contains more than meets the eye. Upon a quick read, Genesis seems to be just a bunch of life stories recorded for our sake to know the past. However, these stories contain much wisdom for our living. Each story begins with a person chosen of God. God placed, let's say, a goal or an objective before each person. Now we have free will so each person has a choice to be obedient or not.

We also find some promises in these stories. What are the promises based on? “If you do this, I, the Lord, will make thee _ _ _ _ _.”

These promises are based on blessings from obedience. If we are obedient, we will find blessings which our Father will surely provide. And we can read of our Lord's providence over and over in this book. If we do not obey, we have read of that result as well (Pharaoh). I'm safe to say salvation comes only of Jesus but what blessings can be found in obedience to God's Word! He will not force blessings upon us. When we are obedient, will He not provide? Word of Growth

God's Testing

Often in life, God will test the obedience and faith of His servants. We can see this in the lives of these men in Genesis. God sent Abraham to places among men he feared. "Sarah, say you are my sister or they will surely kill me." Abraham feared men though he was obedient and did go to these places: he feared men instead of trusting God.

To me this was a test, because these men also feared God. God was in control; these men would have paid severely for any injury done to Abraham. Just as God told Abraham to sacrifice Isaac, God was testing his obedience.

Look at Jacob. “Go serve Laban, Jacob.” Jacob did, and Laban cheated him over and over. What did Jacob do? He kept serving Laban and listening to God’s Word. Did Jacob find blessing before the Lord?

God may lead us through some things in life we would rather not see. However, if we follow His Will (guidance through the Bible) won’t He bless us?

We are taught this very thing throughout the whole Bible. Follow God through all life’s situations and you will receive a great reward.

As Abraham, God, too, may test you. Maybe God has tested you as Abraham, placing you right in front of His people – followers of God.

We take His blood (death) upon our house (person) and place His blood upon our hearts (Door). And our faithful Father passes by our house. This blood saves us unto salvation into eternity in Christ. God is good, and this is our Passover. We have a week to remember His forgiveness, His passing by our sin. What a Great Gift - our Lord even paid for our forgiveness with the blood of His Son, our Lamb. Free of cost to us and undeserved. I pray that you know His Name – YHWH!

Word of Growth

Little by little:

In the end of Chapter 23, God promise to drive out the inhabitants of the land He had given to Israel. God is doing an amazing work for His children, but on a closer look He is doing it in wisdom as caring Father. God said he would drive these inhabitants out little by little, that the land and animals would not overtake them. As children, God was only going to give Israel a little responsibility at a time. “I will give you ten square miles, work with that for now, and if you do well . . .” God won’t leave us to fail, but He will allot us as we are able. What father or mother wants their child to fail? How wise would God seem if He did so? God is above all the wisest and greatest, most gracious Father anyone could ever have.

God is working this very same way with us. He wishes to bless us in such ways we could not even imagine, but we are not ready. If God gave us everything now we would probably stumble. He is not willing to see that.

Trust Him. Obey Him. Claim these blessings.

Word of Growth

Self for Others:

In Exodus 32:32 Moses did something so very amazing, so courageous, that we should notice. Israel had made a terrible sin, they made and worshipped an idol – a golden calf. God was going to kill them all and start over. This was a serious offense and they knew better. God had written of this sin in the Ten Commandments which Moses received on the mount. Imagine, God no more said it and they did it. Now God said, “Let me get rid of these stubborn people.” Moses said “God, please forgive these people. Do not let Your wrath burn upon Your children, but forgive them. And if not, you can just remove my name from Your book as well.” When Moses came down from the mount to see Israel worshipping a calf he was furious. Moses made Israel eat that calf! They melted it down and put it in water and he made the people drink that calf all up! Sin is costly. Moses did punish Israel and now he was standing up for these stubborn people he put so much work into.

Moses said, “God, why did you have me do all this if You were just going to destroy these people? If You do this, let me be a part with them. Kill me too.” Moses could have said they were horrible and to kill them, but he put his own neck out there.

This is our example. Yes, John messed up, Sandy did wrong, but these are our family and we too can make a stand for them. Not approving of their sin, but not condemning.

Word of Growth

Chapter 5:1 says:

If a person sins in hearing the utterance of an oath, and is a witness, whether he has seen or known *of the matter*—if he does not tell *it*, he bears guilt.

Meditate on this verse for a moment.

What does it mean? Everyone can see scripture in their own way. What I am seeing is that if one sins by using an oath (which is a sin: we are to let our yes be yes and no be no), one shall speak on the issue. This sin is to be confronted and brought into the open if known of or if you've seen the sin. If one does not speak against this sin, they are to become guilty of it.

Let's widen the picture. If you witness any sin but do not confront the sinner, you are seen as sinning as the sinner. The sin could be unintentional – unknown to the sinner. Now, if you don't confront this, aren't you leaving a sinner equipped for condemnation? If your child does something wrong, don't you bring it to their attention? Of course you do – you want the best for your children. What is different about any other human being? We are to love our brothers and sisters and that means looking out for one another. If one does not listen, that sin is no longer on you but on the sinner.

People don't often take well to correction – that's up to them. But as for me I will do my part. This is love and people don't even know how to react to love. Love is lacking so when we see it we don't understand it. Love takes discipline. Nothing weak in that.
