Daily Thought

“Scapegoat”

Back in Chapter 16 we read of the scapegoat. Aaron made atonement for Israel yearly in a sacrifice which called for two goats – one for sacrifice and one to release into the wilderness (a scapegoat). Now Jesus had done this work for us – He filled the part of both of these scapegoats.

Here's the deal. Aaron took two goats and cast lots (rolled dice or drew sticks) to see which goat would die and which one would be released. These goats had a 50/50 shot – one would die and one would live. Which one is better off? Aaron kills one in front of the tabernacle and the other he whispers all of Israel's sins into its ear and releases it into the wilderness. This signified the removal of sin – the goat took all the sin of Israel with it. Can you imagine how fast this goat must have fled? That poor goat

probably wished to trade places with the sacrificial goat if it could have understood all Aaron said.

That seems to be a humorous story to me but this was God's prescribed way. Take that sin and let it all go! Tell that goat and leave it there. Chase that thing right out of the camp –right out of your life.

See Isaiah 38:17 – God places our sins behind Him, into the depths of the sea will He put them (Micah 7:19).

Once we've chosen the right path (Jesus) and repent (change) from our past, God no longer remembers that part of us – so why should we? Leave it behind and live for God!




“Molech”

In Chapter 20 of Leviticus we spoke of prostitution to the god Molech. I thought I would explain some on this topic.

Romans 1:28

“And even as they did not like to retain God in their knowledge, God gave them over to a debased mind, to do those things which are not fitting. . .”

These individuals knew of God and His Will but would not retain what was given them. So God allowed them to do those ignorant things they chose to do. The human mind is debased and lacking without God. God then gave them to do their own will.

Molech/Chemosh was a fire god. Molech was a bronze statue with the face of a calf and hand which were held out to receive something. Molech was located in the valley of Hinnom (the place Jesus called hell on earth). The worshippers of Molech would burn a fire under him until his hands would glow red and offer their children to him. They would beat the drums so they would not have to hear the screaming infants. That is a debased mind! People chose this way rather than God. Even King Solomon did this! Man surely does not know the way.

Proverbs 14:12

“There is a way that seems right to a man, But its end is the way of death.”

Hinnom was also known as Ben-Hinnom, Tophet, and Gehenna in these last three verses. Jesus speaks of hell fire and judgment. He actually uses the word “Gehenna” – “You are in danger of Gehenna.”

Hinnom was located just outside of Jerusalem and was used as a waste dump in Jesus’ time. It was as hell because it was always smoldering from burning waste.

“Test your teachers!” If we can write it or speak it – we shall be able to back it! Too many today speak falsely without proof. Test the truth – don’t take every doctrine or teaching for granted.

Word of Growth

Quail:

Israel continued to complain against God; they cried to Moses but God was instructing him so as I said, they complained against God. Bad idea! In chapter 11, Israel complained "we have no meat to eat, all we have is this manna" (bread from heaven).

We can see the humor in all of Israel's complaints now as those after us will see our ways, I'm sure. "Give us, give us, and give us more!" God says "You want meat? I'll give you meat!" God sent them quail, but not just a few. God sent quail so numerous they were a day's journey each way of the camp! Imagine as far as you could walk in a day. The quail were as far as you could walk and they were two cubits deep (3 feet);

piled three feet deep as far as you could see (see 11:31). The Israelites gathered then homers at the least (6 bushels or 220 liters) per person.

God gave them all they wanted and they became sick while the meat was still between their teeth! The amount of people that died in their lust for meat were so great, they called that place “kiboth” (verse 34) which means, “Graves of craving”. A whole grave yard of gluttons.

Be careful of what you ask for in life – you may receive just that. Even to the fullest.

The wife and children of Bill were listed just that way, the Family of Bill. If, as a family, we all operate as a single unit as intended, than a single name for that family would be enough.

Though this was the case in public, a woman still had a very difficult and important role in the home. She took care of all things around the home. They did all the teaching up to a certain age – Biblical and life.

And even now the male would not keep up to the abilities of a woman in the home. Though times are changing and women are now working as men at careers, thank you ladies for your strength and patience – without you, a man would never make it. We'd still be living as the animals under a tree somewhere in the wilderness.

Word of Growth

Wilderness:

Israel spent forth years in captivity, then forty more in the wilderness before reaching the Promised Land. Moses never even made it – he never stepped foot into the

Promised Land. He was disobedient and struck a rock God had told him to speak to for water. Moses saw this land from afar – then was gathered to his kin.

We are likened to Israel and even to Moses going through this process. We start life in bondage. We're slaves to our sinful nature until we reach the age of understanding. Then we are tempted as we walk through our wilderness of sin. Our wilderness experience starts when we understand right and wrong. This is when temptation starts – I want to but it's wrong. Do I or don't I? We go back and forth in our trials in this time. Some of our choices are good, but we still learn in error. Sin will be present for our entire life – we can learn to control our actions and thus control sin. We grow closer to God with age in an ideal world. And as Moses we too can see God's Promised Land in our future – the land flowing with milk and honey, the land of steak and eggs, the land of banana splits and root beer floats.

All the good we can't even begin to contemplate will be awaiting us as the faithful in the Promised Land. We in our natural ability may never completely tame this wilderness, though we have our one name under heaven which delivers us from this sin, "Jesus Christ our beloved". Lean upon Him for your guidance (Proverbs 3:5-6).

Song of Solomon 8:5 – "Who is this coming up from the wilderness, leaning upon the beloved? I awakened you under the apple tree. There your mother brought you forth."

We are all considered the heir, "men and women alike". We need the strength of our beloved husbandman (Jesus) to guide us, for our mothers left us beneath that apple tree where sin began – not by choice of course.

Everyone sees their own way through sin – no one can do that for us. Though our knowledge of Jesus awakens us from under this tree (sin). Work to see the land, trust Jesus and His guidance. You've been awakened – don't go on in a groggy sleep-deprived mess – be alert and study to know the way.

See Matthew 7:22-23 – “I do not know you” would be a terrible thing to hear. Get to know your Father. And whatever else you do share Him with your children and those after them. Do not let them lose this knowledge!

Many have tried to corrupt and slander God’s word, make sure we the believers keep it. God bless you all today and always.

Daily Thought

But the Lord is with you – isn't that great? We have numbers, authority, and ability beyond measure when standing with God. Not that these matter when God is with you.

I no longer recall where I read this, but remember this in your trials. “One man (person) standing directly on the word of God is the majority.” Nothing else in life can win against these odds. God is our strength. Not I, God, but You! Glory to You.

Daily Thought

Isaiah 54:17 "No weapon formed against You shall prosper, and every tongue which rises against you in judgment You shall condemn. This is the heritage of the servants of the Lord." We have life beyond the grave. We have eternity with God's blessings. No one can take it! We're immortal . . .

Daily Thought

We’ve spoken of tithing previously; I wish to speak once more briefly of it. Many don’t wish to speak of giving anything away though we are only giving a small part of what has been given to us from our Father above. Tithing is meant to support God’s cause. Does this mean we need to donate to the church, the needy and homeless, or who? No, we can do what we feel is just with our portion. God has given us a piece of blessing to bless others with it. This I believe should be for our family of believers. Not necessarily the church, but within the body of believers. The Bible says if one does not work he does not eat; and if a man will not support his family or near kin, it is a sin for him (2 Thessalonians 3:10; 1 Timothy 5:8). By no means shall they receive this portion. Proverbs 3:27 “Do not withhold good from those to whom it is due, when it is in the power of your hand to do so.” Use discretion – more blessed to give than receive.

Word of Growth

Food:

Once again we can eat what we choose to eat; we are no longer held to many of the Old Testament standards. Though if the Old Testament is our tutor, then God would be pleased for us to follow it. Wouldn't you agree?

Colossians 2:16 "So let no one judge you in food or in drink, or regarding a festival or a new moon or Sabbaths."

We are freed from these statues though how interesting they seem to me. One can no longer be saved by these. Christ is our only way to salvation. God spoke these past commands for a reason – they pleased Him. His people were a separate, sanctified, holy people! We were always meant to be different. God gave us His words for wisdom and others will view us as wise if we follow God's words. One can follow these statues out of love but not for honor or salvation. This could be a way of fasting to honor God – not self. Fasting is to be personal, it is to honor God, and humble one's self before the Father. If you are up for it, I believe it would be fun to select one thing from this list of clean food and honor God by eating it. If you are willing to join me in a fast we could all join in a small meal of your choice from this list at dinnertime on the last day of the month. This is to give time for preparation. List Chapter 13: 3-21. I will be eating a fish dinner at 5:00 p.m. on the last day of May to honor God. A small and fun thing to obey and honor God as well as showing unity of the body.

Just leave us a way to respond.

Daily Thought

Again, all the Old Testament is good for the prosperity of the believer. Remember, though, Jesus in our New Testament commanded forgiveness. No longer does physical death result from one’s sin – though spiritual death is a sure result of the unrepentant sinner. Also we no longer follow the “eye for an eye or tooth for a tooth”. We are to forgive those who use and abuse us though we don’t have to keep in their reach.

Daily Thought

All these statutes were given for a lesson. God's people had been doing these very things! Another good example of being given over to a depraved mind. When humans are left without guidance, we can see the results. Follow and honor God. "No foolishness in that!"

Word of Growth

A Prophet Like Moses

In Chapter 18: 15-22, Moses speaks the words of God saying "The Lord will raise a Prophet like me from your midst." When our Lord spoke to Israel from the Mount, they were so in fear they asked that He not speak to them again in that way. So God would send His word through chosen people; in this case He promised a Prophet like Moses to speak His word (verse 18 – "I will put My words in his mouth).

One could think this Prophet to be Joshua, but I believe this Prophet to be further off in the future. Let's see the clues. Verse 15 "The Lord your God will raise up for you a Prophet like me from your midst from your brethren. Him you shall hear."

God raised Jesus from the tribe of Judah (Genesis 49:10; Luke 3:33). He also raised Jesus from the grave.

Jesus spoke the words of God even in the synagogues while being in danger of persecution.

"If you don't hear My words through Him, I will require that of you" as in verse 19. Only Jesus could have such authority. Verse 22 – a true prophet. If of God all the prophet speaks will come true. No one could ever find fault with Jesus. 1 John 3:5 and 2 Corinthians 5:21. "No sin could be found in Him." Everything He did and spoke was righteous, from the true Prophet. Only two people in our Bible were known of or called "meek" – Jesus and Moses.

Numbers 12:3 KJV

(Now the man Moses was very meek, above all the men which were upon the face of the earth.)

Matthew 11:29; 21:5 KJV

⁹Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls.

⁵Tell ye the daughter of Sion, Behold, thy King cometh unto thee, meek, and sitting upon an ass, and a colt the foal of an ass.

Due to translation, we've used the King James Version to show the actual word "meek". Jesus and Moses are the only two men who shared this title in our Bible. "A Prophet Like Me." Meekness is not weakness, but more of a patient restraint. Both Moses and Jesus shared this trait – and neither were weak or timid. Moses fought many battles; Jesus cleansed the temple of sinful men. Not weak traits.

This section is one of many in our Old Testament which speaks of our coming Messiah; one only need to know their Bible facts to see this. Pieces of our Bible could be overlooked easily if one is not familiar with the Scriptures. Between the Old Testament and the New Testament scripture there are many prophecies – 351 of which can be listed as fulfilled, though many of these even pointed out are difficult to understand. Again, one must know their facts.

One more simple fact: Jesus is God's Son, He is not a mere prophet, but He IS THE Prophet. Many beliefs like to claim Jesus is just a prophet. One could not say this in honesty of Jesus. Jesus claimed his Sonship as well as His Deity and equalness to the Father. If this was not true then wouldn't Jesus be only a liar and not a great prophet or just a prophet? Jesus never lied. Fault or sin was not found in Jesus. If He said "I AM", then He was.

God blesses you in your obedience; continue in this journey. Only blessings can follow Biblical studies.

Word of Growth

As an eagle:

Deuteronomy 32:11-12 "As an eagle stirs up its nest, hovers over its young, spreading its wings, taking them up, carrying them on its wings, so the Lord alone lead him, and there was no foreign god with him."

I read in a study of eagle Christians, but I don't recall in full the whole lesson. I do remember the habit of the eagle. As this scripture states, God as an eagle leading Jacob so does an eagle lead her young.

An eagle is a very proud creature. Did you know during a thunder storm the eagle does not take shelter but flies to great heights above the storm to glide on its wind? An eagle is not fearful. In the lesson I read, I believe a D.N.R. was explaining an eagle's process of learning to fly. An eagle builds its nest high above the ground in the cliffs. Imagine a baby eagle becoming of age to fly looking thousands of feet to the

ground from its nest. “No mom, not today. I don’t feel like learning today, mom. I can learn later.” Well, mother knows her baby’s thoughts, as God ours’. Mom slowly starts to break up the nest. Making it not too cozy, even shaky and dangerous. Then she tricks the baby into climbing on her back for a nice ride. How does she do this? As the Scripture says she hovers over her young after stirring her nest. As she hovers, the nest begins to shake and even break. After a while the baby begins to think of ways to get out of this situation. As we do during our trials. The baby thinks and finally says “I will sneak behind mom and then jump on her back –she can’t shake me with her hovering from there.” Well, mom was expecting this – as God knows how we will react to things. When the baby climbs on mom’s back, she soars above the clouds quickly and gives her little one time to settle. Then she drops the little bird. She lets that little thing fall off her back. Often in life we must fall down before leaving – mom lets her baby fall and then before it hits the ground she swoops it up and takes it all the way back up again, waits for it to settle and drops her baby again!

Does life seem this way to you? Does God lift you to His side and lead you and when things seem well, maybe you get ahead of yourself and fall to old habits. When you see you are wrong, He picks you up and says to try again. I feel this way in life. Hopefully soon I will start to fly. I’m tired of falling. Once again, eagles are proud. Mom is only going to allow her baby so many attempts. I don’t exactly recall the exact number or days the bird has and maybe that’s best. We’re not able to know a number of attempts we are allowed. If that bird can’t fly, mom stops catching it one day and that bird falls to its death. There’s a point when one knows something is not right with that one. Nature must take its course. God doesn’t limit forgiveness – though life does. We will never know our end. We shall be careful to live acceptable lives as if every day is our last. Make good, godly decisions. Seek ye first the kingdom of God and all else will be given to you. Soar above as God has intended for you! God bless you.
